The Legislature that convened Tuesday, Jan. 10, 2023, for it's 2023 session is still mostly White and male. 70 percent of lawmakers are men. At least 54 percent of lawmakers are white, and nearly half are white men. But the incoming legislature also has the highest number of women lawmakers in at least the last five sessions.
"The demographics of the Legislature generally follow patterns in terms of the party. The Republican base remains an older and Anglo party, so the Republican members tend to be in those categories," said University of Houston political science Professor Brandon Rottinghaus in a Jan. 9, 2023, article by Aaron Torres in the Dallas Morning News. "For the Democrats, the base of the party is always solidly African-American and, to an increasing extent, Hispanic, so your seeing those trends too. I would throw down the gantlet to get legislators to diversify their ideas as well."

Though still significantly outnumbered by the more than 5000 men who have served over the years the addition of 13 new woman lawmakers pushed the all time tally of woman elected to the states halls of power to 192 - up from 179 at the start of the last legislative session two years ago, insuring that their voice was heard.

This year, women lawmakers took 54 of the 181 seats at the capital. There are twice as many Democratic women lawmakers as Republican. Both the Speaker of the Texas House, Dade Phelan, R-Beaumont, and the Texas Senate, lieutenant governor Greg Abbott, R-Houston are white males. Despite lack of diversity in some measures, lawmakers hope to legislate diversity.

House Bill 1006, for example, sponsered by Carl Tepper, R-Lubbock, would mandate changes to the Texas Education Code. One would "foster a diversity of viewpoints" and "maintain political, social, and cultural neutrality." Another would prohibit the funding, promotion, sponsorship, or support of any office of diversity, equity, and inclusion.

## Part 2

There are four errors per item.
If fixing one error creates another, it counts as one.

There is some subjectivity in all editing. If a student finds another "error" or rewrites a sentence, the judges will have to consider how to award points.

This section is worth a maximum of 10 points.

ๆ1 - "at least" - be more specific
\$1 - In general, female and male are adjectives. Woman or women is increasingly common as an adjective. In this context, "female" is probably better, but "women" is not wrong. Same later in the story.

Spell out 70 as a number that begins a sentence. Students may choose to rewrite this sentence so it becomes $70 \%$ but not at the beginning of the sentence.
q2 - Lowercase professor before a name as more of a job description than a formal title.

ๆ|3 - If left as "women," change to plural.

ๆ4 - Greg Abbott is the governor. Dan Patrick is the lieutenant governor.

- Highest level: Are there any legal or ethical issues with the story?
- Middle level: Does the story uses the right sources? Does it flow?
- Lowest level: Grammar, spelling, punctuation, style
