Notes for judges

No. 3 – bloodbath One word, an exception to Webster's New World College Dictionary.

No. 8 – An 's is required when a term involves a plural word that doesn't end in s, such as children's hospital, people's republic, etc.

No. 13 — Mass nouns — things that can't be counted — are singular: None of the coffee was poured.

No. 15 — palate refers to the roof of the mouth and the sense of taste (to have a sophisticated palate); palette is the term for an artist's paint board.

Notes to judges

No. 1 – A student could put a semicolon between the first two sentences instead of making it two separate sentences.

A speaker stands behind a lectern, on a podium or rostrum, or in the pulpit. There are other ways to fix this, but you can't stand on a lectern.

No. 2 – "To actually win" is a split infinitive. Further, if a person wins, he or she wins. The word "actually" is unnecessary.

The sentence is in passive voice and contains a dangling modifier. Fixing the passive voice solves the dangling modifier problem.

No. 5 – more than, over – Acceptable in all uses to indicate greater numerical value.

Tips for judges

Part 2

There are four errors per item.

If fixing one error creates another, it counts as one.

There is some subjectivity in all editing. If a student finds another "error" or rewrites a sentence, the judges will have to consider how to award points.

Notes for judges

Mid-level errors:

¶1 — Knowing that the state had a surplus and not a deficit.

¶1 – The story reflects four ideas: raises, funding, vouchers and safety. Only three are mentioned in the lead.

¶4 – Knowing that Dan Patrick is the lieutenant governor as repeated later in the story.

¶7 – Note elimination of extra words an wordy phrases.

Low-level errors:

 $\P1$ – AP uses the day of the week.

¶6 – A gamut is a complete range.

¶7 – AP stories generally spell out ISD on first reference.

Tips for judges

Part 3

This section is ranked to break a tie in the combined scores of parts 1 and 2. Assign no points.

The entry will be disqualified if the student made no effort on Part 3 and the entry is involved in a tie.

Judges should compare the papers of students who tied, ranking them accordingly.

When judging Part 3, holistically read the changes the student indicated starting with the highest level of editing.

- Highest level: Are there any legal or ethical issues with the story?
- Middle level: Does the story uses the right sources? Does it flow?
- Lowest level: Grammar, spelling, punctuation, style

Two-thirds of parents responding to the survey said there is a moderate risk that their child may experience some form of bullying, sexual harassment, or discrimination while at school.
