

ESSAY PROMPT

Pre-election polls had many expecting a nationwide "red wave" of Republican victories, with voters blaming President Biden and the Democrats for the economic pain brought by surging inflation. But that "red wave" didn't happen.

Discuss some specific issues leading up to the November midterm election as well as outcomes and surprises of the elections in Texas and other states.

POTENTIAL DISCUSSION POINTS PREPARED Dec. 1, 2022 might include, but should not be limited to...

- Election There were no significant disruptions at polling places as conspiracy
 theorists warned. Some pundits viewed this as a "return to normalcy" and expressed a
 sigh of relief.
- *Key issues* Exit polls nationwide showed that the percentage of people who said inflation and abortion were key was nearly equal. In swing states like Michigan, voters cited abortion (45%) over inflation (29%) as a top concern in exit polling. Immigration and democracy itself were other issues voters noted.
- Supreme Court and abortion "The 2022 midterm election was expected to be a referendum on Joe Biden. It's closer to say it was a referendum on the Supreme Court, and the Supreme Court lost," said William Galston, a liberal political theorist, Brookings Institution senior fellow, and Wall Street Journal columnist. The midterm election was the first since the Supreme Court overturned the constitutional right to an abortion. Since then, 12 states have put in place total bans on the procedure and other states have enacted restrictions. In the Nov. 8 election, voters in California, Michigan and Vermont approved state constitutional protections for abortion
- Inflation With nearly one-third of midterm election voters indicating inflation was their top campaign concern this year, attention now turns to what the new political alignment in Washington will mean for tackling the issue. The annual inflation rate for the U.S. is 7.7% for the 12 months ended October of 2022 after rising 8.2% previously, according to U.S. Labor Department data published Nov. 10.
- Gas prices This year's turbulent prices the national average peaked at over \$5 in June, tumbled into September, then leveled off have offered a real-time demonstration of what many researchers have found. Gas prices can affect consumer sentiment and presidential approval ratings (never mind that presidents typically have little control over gas prices). Biden's approval rating was 39% around election time.
- *Climate change* Climate change didn't influence the campaigns in the same way that the economy and reproductive rights did. It hardly made headlines.
- Texas governor's race Republicans once again won top statewide seats in the midterm election. Texas Gov. Greg Abbott will serve a third term after defeating Democratic challenger Beto O'Rourke in one of the most polarizing and expensive races in Texas political history. O'Rourke found himself bumping into the ideaology of the Democrats in Washington, who presented themselves as maybe too liberal for the rest of the country, especially for Texas. His political future remains uncertain.
- Texas leadership In addition, Lt. Gov. Dan Patrick, the incumbent, won as did Attorney General Ken Paxton.
- Texas representation in Congress The Lone Star State sent 25 Republicans and 13 Democrats to Washington, D.C., in January.
- *Georgia governor* Gov. Brian Kemp, a Republican who refused to help overturn the results of the 2020 presidential election in Georgia, with 53.4% of the vote beat Stacey Abrams, a Democrat he also narrowly defeated four years ago.
- Pennsylvania senator Democrat John Fetterman won Pennsylvania's pivotal race for U.S. Senate, flipping a Republican-held seat as he recovered from a stroke during the bare-knuckled campaign. Fetterman defeated Dr. Mehmet Oz, the smooth-talking and wealthy heart surgeon-turned-TV celebrity who had just moved to the presidential battleground state to run for Senate.
- Trump Former President Donald Trump announced his intention to run for election in 2024 only a few days after the midterm.
