


Why you should enter...

Essays should focus on a prominent or relatively unknown Latino individual, organization or movement in Texas history. How has the subject of the essay significantly influenced today's Latino communities?

Thesis statement is easily found and well worded

Tangibility

Quality sources

Citation method- MLA, APA, etc...

Parenthetical citations

Concise

General Guidelines

- Essay with a word count between 1,500 and 2,500 words.
- Research paper format MLA format or APA format recommended
- Source citations and bibliography required
- Essays should display original research; use of primary sources and interviews strongly encouraged
