RESOURCES: A SUPPORTIVE NETWORK

- It starts in the practice room
- Establish relationships with competing schools
- Cultivate connections
- Invite the principal to a meet
- Reach out to district PR
- Tell the family what the students don't
 - Parking lot talks



LESSONS FROM INVITATIONAL MEETS

- Thank the judges*
- Know when to ignore feedback*
- Say hello to the host(s)
- Be helpful when possible
- Filter results for those in your UIL district
- Network
- Celebrate the wins, learn from the losses

PLANNING YOUR PRACTICE

- Preparing by looking at students' needs
- Assess skill levels
- Identify what event(s) students are passionate about
- Set Individual Goals
 - Copy editing and headline points, revising time, one story per session, etc.
- Assign books, articles, and online tools
 - Bobby Hawthorne, magazine features, Quill
- Create a system for regular feedback and one-on-one coaching sessions

DISTRICT, REGIONAL, STATE

- More work with less students
 - Establish trial periods and cut-off dates
- Look at past state winners
 - Find trends, themes and style choices
- Solicit feedback from areas outside your expertise
- Lock-in dates with students
 - It's always TAFE, FBLA, or prom
- Keep a list of areas to target during the next academic year

- Celebrate them online and off











KEEPING STUDENTS ENGAGED OVER SUMMER
