When can we hold the A+ OAP Contest?

Could we hold Academics in the Fall and OAP in the Spring?

YES!

Local decision/either semester.

District Alignments

Who is in my district?

 JH schools are not assigned to junior high districts or conferences by the UIL office.

 Schools may follow the high school academic and/or athletic district assignments or form their own district.

 Any points earned will be return to a school's home district championship.

No online registration or title entry.

Contest Rules- How many levels???

The winner of a junior high school one-act play contest shall not advance beyond the district level.

Winners shall be <u>ranked</u> first, second and third only.

CONTESTANTS-Who can compete?

Students in the seventh and eighth grades may enter this contest.

Sixth graders may participate in the contest *if* they are on the same campus as the seventh and eighth grade.

What is different/same in the A+ contest?

- Directors for A+ OAP are not required to be full-time employees of the school district.
- No official A+ OAP Calendar.
- No Speechwire entry system.
- Only 1st-3rd awarded.

Same contest rules-incl

- Time limits.
- Same scenic/lighting rules.
- Must use TTAO Judges
- Same # of awards
- Play approvals

Revised A+ OAP Handbook coming in August

Contest or Festival? What is the difference?

A Festival is a non-UIL contest.

- Local Rules apply
- Festival-No UIL Points or UIL District Championship.
- TTAO judge not required.

UIL Rule Violations that would make a play ineligible.

- 1. Use of ineligible students.
- 2. Exceeding the number allowed in the performing company.
- 3. Exceeding the time limits on performance or set-up or strike.
- 4. The use of firearms, explosives or combustible materials.
- 5. The use of additional unit set.
- 6. The director communicating with the company during the performance.

Do you pick a play you *love* or do you pick a play for your students?

WHEN CAN I SUBMIT A PLAY, NOT ON THE APPROVED LIST, TO UIL?

- August 1-April 15 for Junior High schools.
- No later than 45 days before contest.

Please secure your royalties for performance before starting rehearsals.

How to get started...start countingcount

How many can REALLY commit?

How many boys/girls/gender neutral?

Prioritize each list by "best or most promising" to "needs much improvement"

This will help you narrow down scripts.

Reasons to pick from the UIL approved list...

You do not need to submit play to UIL.

Do not send to us!

You MUST receive publisher permission to perform for competition, purchase scripts and pay royalties.

See <u>UIL page</u> for submitting a play to UIL for approval.

What's next? Enjoy the Rehearsal Process

You MUST read a WHOLE script and not someone's edit of a script to know the fullness of the story.

Not all kids are good with certain scripts.

Rehearsal tips

- Keep it fun. Keep it active.
- Learn the play, not just the lines.
- Make it a goal to get better each rehearsal.

- Yes, you can have parents help you with costume, scenery props.
- Keep Scenery, Lighting and Sound needs simple.

Design Considerations

Junior High Students are smaller/Unit Sets are heavy, so..

- Budget
- Storage
- Boxes, Benches, and Ladders Oh My!
- Projections

Yes, you can have parents help you with costume, scenery props.

- Keep Scenery, Lighting and Sound needs simple.
- Remember 60/40 rule

What's Next???

- Clinics- Consider taking your play to a clinic.
- You can host a clinic!
- You have 2 hours with clinician
 - They must see your show and critique within the two hours.




