WHY COACH UIL?

- Enrichment and extension of curriculum
- When students get excited about academic competition, they become more engaged in the classroom
- Standardized test scores are improved
- It challenges the bright but underachieving student
- Opens scholarship opportunities for students

WHY COACH UIL?

- Develops self-esteem, self-confidence; makes students feel worthy for being intelligent
- Enhances every part of the state curriculum
- Helps students grow in self-discipline and as human beings; prepares for real world
- The "whole" student is developed
- UIL gives EVERY kid a place to belong!

Speech

- 6 Events from three skill categories
 - Debate
 - Extemporaneous Speaking
 - Oral Interpretation
 - Plus 7th event = Congress

Speech

 Students are permitted to enter 2 events in the speech area, plus policy debate, plus Congress = 4 speaking opportunities

Also be aware of the Academic Conflict
 Pattern. Some students may compete in both speaking events and academic events. Know which events conflict.

Congress

- Regions organized by Education Service
 Centers, not traditional UIL districts
- Legislative assembly modeled after the U.S. Congress
- Contestants write bills/resolutions
- Debate social and political policies using parliamentary procedure
- Handbook downloadable for free

Prose and Poetry

- Oral reading not memorized
- 7 minute performance no grace period
- Prepare 2 performances: Categories A & B
- Category requirements
- Documentation to prove meet the categories
- Read the contest handbook

Extemporaneous Speaking

- Divisions: Informative and Persuasive
- Speaker draws 5 topics; chooses 1
- 30-minute prep time; computer files allowed
- 7 minutes maximum; may complete last sentence
- I notecard allowed to use when speaking
- Know what can & can't be in prep room
- Read the contest handbook

Debate

- Cross-Examination Policy Debate
- 1 policy topic used all year long
- Lincoln-Douglas Value Debate
- 2 topics released from UIL State Office
- Fall Topic released in early August
- Spring Topic released in December
- Handbooks can be downloaded for free

Debate

- If you qualify debaters to state in CX or LD debate, be prepared to provide a judge that is experienced to judge on the state level
- YOU can judge! Workshops teaching how at this conference. Take advantage of them!
