The Role of Sound in Theatre

- Sound design enhances the atmosphere and sets the mood.
- It provides cues for actions and transitions.



Understanding UIL Rules for Sound

- UIL holds specific rules for using music and sound in performances.
- Schools must acquire clearances for copyrighted music.
- Original music and public domain pieces are encouraged.

Original and Public Domain Music

- Original compositions must be produced "for hire."
- Research is needed to confirm if a piece is in the Public Domain.

Live Musicians in UIL Theatre

- Live musicians or singers on stage must be dialogue driven.
- Off-stage musicians do not require approval but must follow copyright laws.
- Live music is limited to 19 minutes of total performance time.

Sound Effects and Amplification

- Recorded or live sound effects are allowed without time restriction.
- Electronic amplification is limited to offstage voices.


Copyright Issues in Theatre

- Theatre performances do not fall under Fair Use.
- Small rights vs. Grand rights: know the difference.
 - Grand rights are required for theatrical performances and can be costly.

Icons Terms of the Licenses

Public Domain Dedication (CC0)

Attribution (BY)

Derivative Works (ND)
