A perfect score on the matching portion is 64. For the tiebreaker portion, each element of the answer is worth two points. An answer that requires a Major Work is worth up to 4 points; an answer that does not require a Major Work is worth up to 2 points. On each element of the answer, award two points if the element is correct with correct spelling; award only one point if the element is correct but misspelled. For example, if the contestant has the correct Major Work and Selection but the Selection is misspelled, he or she would receive 3 points for that answer. Do not deduct points for answers that are incorrect or skipped; in those instances the contestant simply receives no points for that answer.
- For the grade 5/6 test and tiebreakers, each element of the answer is worth 2 points. An answer that requires a Major Work is worth up to 6 points; an answer that does not require a Major Work is worth up to 4 points. On each element of the answer, award two points if the element is correct with correct spelling; award only one point if the element is correct but misspelled. Do not deduct points for answers that are incorrect or skipped; in those instances the contestant simply receives no points for that answer.
- Errors in capitalization and punctuation should be treated as spelling errors. The guideline for what is required for correct punctuation and capitalization is the UIL Official Music Memory List, which is provided at the bottom of this page.
