Regional and State Meets

- If you qualify, you are already registered.
- If your student needs to drop, let the alternate know ASAP
- If you have students that are doing well at invitational and virtual meets or if they have qualified in the past, make reservations EARLY!!!! (You can always cancel)
- Parking is a challenge at the State Meet
- Lunch is a challenge at the state meet - plan ahead!
- If you can take alternates, do so - it is a great motivat
