# One Act Play Contest & Rehearsal Information UNLOADING/REHEARSAL

- Arrival: Arrive with company and equipment/scenery at the loading dock on the north side of the building.
  - Arrive with enough time to begin your load in at the time designated (30 minutes prior to rehearsal time)
- Load in: You will be greeted by contest personnel and approved to unload equipment
  - Dock Information:
    - Loading dock height: 52" (no ramp)
    - o Dock roll up door measures 8'-0" W x 12'-0" H.
- Unload your equipment/scenery into a designated area
- Your official rehearsal time will begin when company is on stage and called by the stage manager/contest manager
- Be prepared to provide the contest manager with all necessary paperwork (publisher permission, proof of royalties, substitution forms, copyright disclosure, integrity script, set additions, permission to perform the play not on the approved list, community standards form w/signature and PO/Check)
  - Rehearsal: Each company will have one hour to rehearse their show
- There will be **full disclosure** at rehearsal. Plan to rehearse with all set pieces, fabrics, and items that are used in your performance
- The contest manager must see:
  - Opening sequence
  - Ending sequence
  - Stage combat/weapons



**FIREARM/WEAPONS POLICY**: If your production requires the use of prop firearms it must be contained in a locked storage box/case/container while on site. This includes traveling to and from rehearsal as well as to and from performance. Firearms are NOT allowed to be left in your storage box and must be in the possession of an adult representative of your school. NO firearms can be left unattended in a ready room.





The Studio Theater will be available to each group as a warm up space prior to your performance.



# **Important Contest Information**

### **Space Images & Information**

Dr. Phillip Morgan (Region III-1A Director) will manage this document alongside Mr. Larry Wisdom (Region OAP Contest Manager) throughout the Region Contest. Contact information is preferred through text at 817-773-6571 to our GROUP TEXT. Please make sure you are included in the group text so you receive updates in real time.

### 1. Eligibility Notice

Please send UIL (MachForm) to larry.wisdom777@gmail.com. All other documents required may be presented at the beginning of your rehearsal. You will complete the **Google Doc Playbill** (also attached, just insert your own info and save in the same format) and forward as well for your show's program. You are responsible for all spelling and name changes. **These**forms are due by Friday, April 18, 2025, so that a virtual playbill may be made available to all who desire them.

### 2. Rehearsals

# YOU MAY HAVE TO ARRIVE EARLIER TO ENSURE YOU WILL BE AT REHEARSAL ON TIME.

The Contest Manager will meet you and your company at the loading dock door on the back side of the theatre building just north of the stage, **at least 30 minutes before** your scheduled rehearsal time. Please be on time. You can drive around to the north side of the Performing Arts Center using the parking lot of High School to park your UHaul or Trucks/Trailers. **The directions to the site are included HERE** and your contest manager and stage manager will give you instructions, answer questions, and assist you in the unloading and setting up for your rehearsal.

To ensure compliance with UIL rules, remember that all uses of the basic set must be fully disclosed to the contest manager (or his designee) at the official rehearsal. Unauthorized or undisclosed use of the basic set may be considered a violation. The contest manager (or her designee) shall make any decision concerning the use of the basic set and that decision shall be final.



You will have a minimum of **50 minutes** to rehearse on stage. Be sure that you set and rehearse your technical cues first. Most importantly, establish your light cues - this will be your only time to record them. **There is a strong probability that you will not be able to run your full show in rehearsal.** If your show has simple light cues, this will only take a few moments. If your show has many complicated cues, you should allow a large portion of your rehearsal time to establish these cues. **Spike Tape will be provided for you at the contest site so that you may spike your show during your rehearsal period.** 

You may use your rehearsal time any legal way you wish. The site crew stage manager will remind the director at appropriate times that certain jobs need to be done before your time elapses. Please remember that whatever you don't get accomplished at your rehearsal **cannot** be adjusted later (including lights). Each school must get exactly the same minimum amount of time on stage in rehearsal.

### 3. Admission to the Performances\*\*\*

Food and drink of any kind will not be permitted in the PAC. Admission charge for the Region III-1A One-Act Play Contest will be \$5.25 per day (includes digital ticketing fee), per show, per person - or - patrons may purchase a 'Region OAP Day Pass' for \$15.25 to have access to all shows for the day.

IMPORTANT SPECTATOR (Parent/Friends/Audience) NOTE: Per the UIL rule, we will run shows back-to-back, with no breaks in between (unless called by the Contest Manager). We highly encourage you to be early for any plays you watch (your spectators included) - but if you arrive after a play has begun, we will seat any late arrivals in the back of the house, as we know parents and supporters make every effort to drive out and watch their students.

Dr. Morgan and Mr. Wisdom have seen a combined 1,000+ one-act plays in their careers and this is their recommendation - COME AND SEE ALL OF THE SHOWS. Take a day, embrace the glory that is UIL OAP and enjoy a full immersion of the best Region 3-1A has to offer. In doing this, you are guaranteed to NOT MISS YOUR SCHOOL'S SHOW!  $\odot$ 

My Mom, her best friend, Sheila, and my Memom drove many miles over many years to watch me as a performer - so you get the "Jana Morgan special" house rule. We are thankful for those who support our theatre students and will make certain you get in to see them in contest. Also, in order to maintain the proper atmosphere for enjoying a live theatre performance, we ask you to let your family and friends know that no videos, flash photography or otherwise, may be taken during the performances. The audience should also not bring infants or very young children who are likely to disturb the performances. The PAC seating will be cleaned between audience groups while the next show is setting up on the stage.

TICKETING - Ticketing will be conducted via Hometown Ticketing through PISD.

### 5. Performances

All performances will take place on **Friday**, **April 25**, **2025**. The first play will begin at 8:00am.

Schools will arrive and report directly to the loading dock for entry to their assigned room. Schools will be allowed to enter their assigned dressing/prep rooms beginning at 8:00am on Friday, April 26. Please text the Contest Manager when you arrive so that a student can escort you and your company to your room.

\*\*\*IMPORTANT\*\*\* For performances, companies will operate as follows:

- · Enter the space and move set items, etc. from your tape area/box to Stage Center.
- · Conduct the 7 minute setup period; Small break to prepare for your performance
- Performance
- · Conduct the seven (7) minute strike period
- Load out their traveled set items, etc. to bus for departure

If shows are shorter than allocated, we will expedite the day and progress forward with an advanced schedule. Once the judges are in place, the directors have entered the house, and all is ready, your show will be announced to the audience. At the conclusion of the announcement, the show is in your technician's hands. At the end of your show, please meet at the stage right side of the stage to begin your strike to the shop. When finished, you will be escorted to the stage to strike your set out of the facility. Following all shows, the Region TTAO Adjudicators will draw for critique order and will critique shows at assigned locations in the facility, simultaneously. Please take precautions with your valuables and personal items.



### **Regarding Performance Critiques**

\*\*Please be advised that our contest judges will provide critiques concluding the final show of the day and after submission of their official contest ballot to the Contest Manager. This is a UIL policy that aligns with a study regarding critiques for the 2025 UIL OAP Season.

### 6. Awards and Critiques

3:15pm (Or Sooner) Awards Ceremony will be Live in the Performing Arts Center.

Adjudicators will draw their respective companies and will critique simultaneously in the house, prior to awards. The presentation of awards will be conducted live after the conclusion of the judges critiques. Region contest will award the following bill:

- Two (2) Advancing Plays (To UIL State Meet);
- One (1) Alternate Play;
- 2 Outstanding Performers, 8 All Star Cast, 8 Honorable Mention All Star Cast (Individual Awards):
- 6 All Star Cast Crew Members (Individual Awards, No points)

<u>From the UIL Leaguer:</u> "The Decision: Accepting the judge's decision requires graciousness on the part of those who advance as well as those who don't. Receiving an award in the One-Act Play Contest is no reason for a riotous demonstration. Applause is the ONLY acceptable method to pay tribute in the theater. Your task as director is to instruct your students on acceptable theater etiquette."

## 7. Script and Royalty Payment

These forms are due by Monday, April 21, 2025, so that the virtual playbill may be produced and your permission to perform can be confirmed. If you are producing scenes from a long play, you must submit show approval from the publisher and/or playwright to cut the script for OAP purposes. Also email any special permissions to the Contest Manager for use of special set pieces and properties, if applicable. Please see the Director's checklist for due dates and necessary paperwork required. We will follow the high school guidelines for one act play contest as closely as possible.

## 8. Staging, Lighting and Performance

The Plano ISD Robinson Fine Arts Center stage is equipped with a computerized ETC Ion EX lighting console. Lights will be pre-set to cover 20 non-gelled acting areas. There will also be 3 color washes: Red, Blue and Green. The cyclorama will be available. Lights will not be reset or re-gelled for any one play. Each area will be independently controlled, although most areas "bleed" into others. The intensity of light can be regulated to suit your needs, but elaborate effects cannot be provided. Your school will be allowed to run lights and sound for your production. The light cues should be recorded. We will furnish a lighting technician to be with you in the booth. Your crew may run lights, or the site crew will do it for you; however, your crew must cue all actions.
