



Four people tied for first place based on an objective score of 31. We'll call them Alpha, Beta, Delta and Gamma.

Alpha was a CI&E studdette. She got a 7 on the essay and remained in first place.

However, Beta, Delta and Gamma didn't do as well on the essay, scoring 6, 5 and 4.5 respectively.





THE JUDGING PROCESS

In a three-person judging panel, must every judge grade each essay? YES! If more than one person judges essays, make certain that judges reach agreement on which essay is the best. Do not rely solely on point totals. One judge may be more stringent than another. It is possible that a weaker essay, graded by a more lenient judge, can be awarded more points than a stronger essay, graded by a more strict judge.

CURRENT ISSUES AND EVENTS REGION 2019

The U.S. economy, the world's third-largest economy, is strong. The Gross Domestic Product is growing at about 2.6% per year. Unemployment was only 3.8% in February. Inflation is only 2.2%. While the national debt is about \$22 trillion, 113 percent of GDP, most economists say that is only unhealthy for short periods.

The academic year has been a year of social movements including, but not limited to, #metoo, #timesup, #neveragain, #blacklivesmatter, #nobannowall. Some of these started in 2017 or 2018. Some are decades old but got new life this year. Pick two or three of the movements active this academic year and discuss the circumstances surrounding each.

The academic year of 2017-2018 has witnessed an impressive amount of movements based around society. Each movement involves different groups of people with a uniting factor, which allows them to introduce change no only in America but also on an international scale. Three of the most important social movements are the #metoo movement, the #blacklivesmatter movement, and the movement centered around gun violence led by the survivors of Marjory Stoneman Douglass High School.

February 17, 2018, oversaw a horrendous massacre of students in Parkland, Florida; however, the day also allowed roots to dig in for the coming change in America. Following the depressed period of mourning, survivors of Nikolas Cruz's rampage began advocating for stricter gun laws to better protect America's schools system. Directly one month after the shooting, the first March for Our Lives took place across the country with famous supporters such as George and Amal Clooney and Elizabeth Warren. The event gained traction quickly with thousands of Americans marching across the nation and having multiple speeches given by organizers like Emma Gonzalez, a survivor and figurehead of the movement. During April, the marches influence spread and caused standards to further their advocacy on gun laws to walk out of the classroom. Multiple walkouts occurred throughout the month both in favor of and against the movement.

After witnessing the immense talking about gun violence, two major retailers — Walmart and Dick's Sporting Goods — stopped selling assault-style weapons and high-

Just as Gandhi's actions drew inspiration from Henry David Thoreau's views on passive resistance so too did his ideas influence Martin Luther King Jr.'s approach to affecting change. These beliefs and their accompanying tactics were emulated by numerous movements around the world and in the United States. Discuss the use, effectiveness, and limitations of passive resistance in advancing the causes of U.S. civil rights movements.

Many young people likened their work in the black civil rights movement to military service insomuch that they may have to lay down their lives in order to achieve victory. Younger leaders felt stymied by the glacial pace of reform seemingly endorsed by their elders and sought more aggressive, sometimes militant, tactics. Discuss the impact youth had on the black civil rights efforts in the United States. Be sure to mention key individuals, groups, and events that accelerated and/or hindered the movement.

Public education advocates created a wish list of issues they wanted Texas legislators to prioritize. Topping that list was increasing state funding for public schools. ■ Points AWARDED:

An 8-10 ESSAY opens with a declarative statement that extends the prompt without re-stating it. The thesis is supported by substantial, relevant information that analyzes the prompt from a range of perspectives—for example, political, social, cultural and economic. It does not provide a mere shopping list of facts. It inteprets the facts without editorializing. The essay is well written and organized with few spelling, grammar or punctuation errors. The essay is clear, precise and succinct.

A 6-7 ESSAY offers a clear thesis with limited development. It either deals with one aspect in depth or with all aspects more superficially while providing limited analysis. Generally good writing and organization skills displayed. May contain errors of fact that do not seriously detract from the quality of the essay.

A 2-4 ESSAY lacks a thesis or presents a confused or undeveloped thesis. It deals with the prompt in a superficial way and offers no analysis. Instead, it tends to editorialize. May contain major fact errors, display poor writing skills and rely on bloated, pretentions language.

A 0-1 ESSAY displays little or no understanding of the prompt. The response is poorly written and organized and may contain significant fact, grammar, punctuation and/or spelling errors that detract from the clarity of the response.
