Tournament Fees:

For regional tournament practice round, <u>make checks payable to Van Zandt Country Club</u>. Price includes green fee, range balls and coaches' cart.

Practice Round Fee: \$20 per person

For regional tournament entry fee, make checks payable to Tyler ISD. Listed below are the charges for the Regional Golf Championship. Prices includes tournament green fees (practice rounds not included), practice balls, and coaches' cart during tournament rounds only. *(Entry due at Coaches Meeting – Please do not mail)*

District Results / Regional Entries:

District results/regional entries should be emailed to <u>greg.priest@tylerisd.org</u> immediately after qualifying. The regional entry form should be typed or printed.

Coaches are asked to call the tournament director immediately for any team roster changes.

General Admission:

Admission is free. Videoing is permitted, but not reviewable by any player during a round.

Practice Round:

Teams/players may play one practice round after qualifying of the regional tournament. Teams/players are encouraged to take their practice round early. If taking a practice round early, inform the tournament director and then contact golf course to schedule tee time. Boys - Teams/players opting to not take a practice round early will be given a time on Sunday, April 14. Girls - Teams/players opting to not take a practice round early will play on Tuesday, April 16 with a 3:00 p.m. shotgun start. If taking a practice early, call VZCC to schedule.

Coaches Meeting:

The coach's meeting will be held at VZCC:

Boys - Sunday, April 14 at 4:00 p.m. Girls – Tuesday, April 16 at 4:00 p.m.

Substitutions made, spellings corrected and course rules, hole locations, etc., shall be reviewed.

A credit card will be required at the coaches meeting for schools to run a concession tab.

Schools should present tax exempt documentation.

Tournament Competition:

Boys - Monday, April 15/Girls – Wednesday, April 17:

District Champion Teams shall be paired together by district team scores and begin play on the #1 tee. District 9, 10, 11, 12 Medalists shall follow the teams on #1. District Runner-up Teams shall be paired together by district team scores and begin play on the #10 tee. District 13, 14, 15, 16 Medalists shall follow the teams on #10.

Boys - Tuesday, April 16/Girls - Thursday - April 18:

Low eight scoring teams of 1st round shall begin play on the #1 tee. Low eight scoring medalists of 1st round shall follow teams on #1 tee. Remaining eight teams of 1st round shall begin play on the #10 tee. Remaining eight medalists of 1st round shall follow teams on #10 tee.

Tee times will be posted at Van Zandt CC Pro Shop, on the Tyler ISD Athletics website, and SportYou.

Tournament Play:

The pro shop will open each day at 6:30am and balls will setup on the range starting at 7:00am. Tournament play shall begin at 8:30am on Monday/Wednesday and 8:00am and on Tuesday/Thursday.

Tournament Schedule

The Regional Tournament should be a 2-day 36-hole tournament.

Scoring Method

Team honors shall be determined by adding the best four scores for each 18-hole round of the five players who enter as a team. The team with the lowest score will be the team winner.



Ties

In the event of a tie in either the team scoring or medalist scoring, we will proceed with the playoff format attached to this packet. We must have an outright place finisher from 1st through 4th place in both the Team standings and Medalist standings.

<u>Substitution</u>

There shall be no substitution allowed in the individual competition. Once the tournament has begun, no substitution (except for injury or illness) shall be allowed on a team, as a team is composed of five players.

Protests

Any protest must be initiated by a contestant or coach representing a participating school before the tournament director finalizes scores.

<u>Coaching.</u>

- A coach may engage with the player(s) tee to green (not on the green).
- At district, regional, and state competitions, only two coaches are allowed to coach that team/individual once play has begun that day for that team or player(s).

Dress and conduct

Players shall wear school approved attire, collared shirts, and soft spikes. Players may not speak privately with non-players; exception-a coach tee to green. Unsportsmanlike conduct, such as illegal coaching, inappropriate language, throwing clubs, course abuse, or improper actions may result in penalty stroke(s) or disqualification.

Caddies and carts

Contestants may **NOT** use caddies or electric carts during district, regional, or state matches without approval by the UIL (golfer must bring approval paperwork). A pull cart may be used.

<u>Electronic Equipment</u>

Distance-measuring devices are allowed under the rules of golf as long as the player does not access any information that is prohibited under this rule. The first breach of this rule means the player gets a two-stroke penalty. A second breach during the same round results in disqualification.

Cell phones / radios

Cell phones and radios are not permitted for players during competition. The first offense is a warning and the second offense is disqualification.

<u>UIL penalty structure</u>

- First Offense Warning
- Second Offense Stroke penalty for player and loss of coaching privileges for the coach
- Third Offense Disqualification of the player for the entire tournament

Spectators

Please make sure all cell phones are turned off or on silent mode. Spectators may encourage but NOT coach nor give advice during play. Spectators shall remain off fairways and maintain an average of 30 yards from players. (Spectator Rules Sheet. Attached)



2024 Regional Golf Tournament (Format & Ties)

Tournament Format

• The tournament will consist of 9-18-27 or 36 holes completed by the entire tournament field from a scoring standpoint.

Team Ties (First, Second, & Third will go to playoff, 4th place ties should proceed straight to #5 below)

- 1. There will be a playoff for all ties immediately on the tournament course after all scores have been posted if possible.
- 2. Team ties will be represented either by the five players, or four players with four player teams.
- 3. The aggregate score of the four low players per hole will determine the team score per hole.
- 4. If a tie cannot be played on the scheduled tournament date, a future date may be scheduled between the teams tied (for advancement purposes only) with approval of the participating schools and permission from the UIL Athletic Director.
- 5. In the event that a playoff is not possible, the individual's score that was not used for each team on Day 2 will be used as the tie-breaking score. If still tied, the team's highest individual tournament total will be used. Continue to use this process until the tie is broken.

Individual (Medalists) Ties (First, Second, & Third will go to sudden death, 4th place ties should proceed straight to #3 below)

- 1. Sudden Death Playoff.
- 2. If a tie cannot be played on the scheduled tournament date, a future date may be scheduled between the individuals tied (for advancement purposes only) with approval of the participating schools and permission from the UIL Athletic Director.
- 3. In the event that a playoff is not possible, per USGA Rule III Section 5A(6), the method of matching cards is to determine the winner on the basis of the best score for the last nine holes. If the tying players have the same score for the last nine, determine the winner on the basis of the last six holes, then last three holes and finally the 18th hole. If this method is used in a competition with a multiple tee start, it is recommended that the "last nine holes, last six holes, etc." is considered to be holes 10-18, 13-18, etc.



2024 Regional Golf Tournament (Play-Off Details)

Team

• Team ties are going to be broken by a five-man team playoff. The four low scores per hole in the playoff will count for the team score. If a team has four players, all four scores will count.

Honor

- Will be determined by drawing numbers through a tournament official.
- 2 numbers will be provided. One team member will draw a number for the team.
- The team that draws the lowest number will have the honor for both groups.

Order

- The two high scores from Day 2 will be paired up as (2).
- The third and fourth from each team's Day 2 round will make up the second group.
- The first and second players from Day 2 will make up the third group.
- All players will complete the hole before moving to the next hole.
- The four aggregate scores will comprise the team.

*If a 3-team playoff exists the order will be:

3-6-6 with the same procedures as a two-team playoff.

This is still a stroke play competition. The coaching rule still applies.

Regardless of the number of teams in the playoff, the players will be paired according to score with the highest scores going first.

Individual

• The player with the lowest second-day score will have the honor. If the second day scores are tied, numbers will be drawn and the player who draws the lowest number will have the honor.



Practice Round Details

Individuals and/or teams qualifying for regional golf may be permitted one practice round of 18 holes at the site of the regional tournament if permitted by the director of the tournament. There shall be no more than one day loss of school time involved with travel in relation to practice preceding the tournament. State law allows only one hour per school day for practice. Once a practice round has been completed, neither teams nor individuals are allowed to return to the site on another day to <u>chip and/or putt</u>.

Sunday Prohibition (Section 1206(b)(3)(A) of UIL Constitution and Contest Rules)

(b) A League participant school shall not participate in any athletic contest or conduct any practice, or teach any plays, formations, or skills on Sunday.

(3) Exceptions.

(A) Golf. If the regional and/or state golf tournaments are scheduled on a Monday, the one 18-hole practice round is allowed at the regional and/or state tournament site and may be played on the Sunday afternoon preceding the meet (**no earlier than 12:00 noon**) if permitted by the regional or state meet director.

General Questions and Answers

May we schedule our 'one practice round' at a time/day other than the day before the tournament? Yes, <u>if the course allows</u>! The assigned practice round the day before the competition is for the convenience of out-of-town schools. Regardless if a player goes on their own, with parents, or with the school coach, <u>they only get one practice round</u>.

May we leave the course & return later that same day to practice putt or chip after our practice round? No! However, use of the driving range, putting, and chipping areas are allowed starting at 12:00 pm on the day preceding the regional or state tournament.

May players go to the tournament site and putt or chip before playing their practice round?

Yes! However, this would count as the practice round for the player.

May players use the "range" once the "one practice round" has been played?

Yes! Players may use the range as long as they comply with UIL Constitution and Contest Rules practice regulations. Putting and Chipping is prohibited until 12:00 pm on the day preceding the regional or state tournament.

May players go out and walk the course at a time other than their practice round?

No! Walking the course is considered playing the course. If special circumstances exist with siblings competing in the state golf tournament, contact A.J. Martinez.



PRACTICE ROUND

- Coaches should immediately notify the tournament director upon qualifying for the regional tournament. The tournament will be briefly discussed and practice round time will be confirmed. Coaches need not notify the Van Zandt CC.
- A coach may choose to play their one permitted practice round prior to Sunday (Mon-Sat). If they do, they should make their own practice round arrangement directly with Van Zandt CC (903-567-2336). They must also inform the tournament director.
- Two schools may mutually agree to switch their assigned tee times on Sunday. If they wish to do so, both coaches must inform the tournament director prior to Sunday play.
- If a team(s) chooses not to play on Sunday, tees times of the remaining teams/medalists will be moved up. Therefore, teams/medalists should be prepared to play earlier than their assigned time.
- Teams/medalists missing their assigned tee time may lose their right to their practice round.
- To maximize time usage for Sunday practice rounds; parents, coaches, alternates, and other nonqualifiers shall be PROHIBITED from playing the practice round with five qualifiers.
- Non-qualifiers may observe the qualifying players on Sunday by following them on the course, but they must remain off the fairway and on the cart paths.
- The practice round fee is \$20 per player (includes green, range balls, and coaches' cart). Checks should be made out to Van Zandt CC.
- After qualifying and having played the one permitted practice round, qualifiers. **MAY NOT RETURN** to Van Zandt CC to play, chip or putt... *Exceptions driving range may be used at any time and players may return to the course to practice putt and/or chip once the 4:00 pm coaches' meeting begins.*



Slow Play

The following conditions and policies shall govern the regulation of the pace of play by the Rules Committee:

- 1. Each player is responsible for playing without undue delay.
- 2. Each player is responsible for his/her group's maintaining proper position on the course in relation to the rest of the field. Each group should be approximately a starting interval behind the preceding group throughout the whole round. The position of the group following has no bearing in determining whether or not a player's pace of play is satisfactory. A group is deemed to be out of position if it reaches any spot on the course as much as fourteen (14) minutes behind the preceding group.
- 3. A group that is out of position for as many as three holes during one round, not necessarily in consecutive order, will be considered in violation of Rule 5-6 (Undue Delay). Players contributing to the delay will be automatically penalized.
- 4. If a player walks ahead of the ball to check the position of the hole or to walk yardage once he/she is at his ball and it is his turn to play, the player will be penalized for undue delay if he/she had previously been warned during the round for slow play.
- 5. Penalties may be assessed <u>without</u> a player having been given prior warning during the round by a Rules Official. It is the responsibility of each player to be aware of his position on the golf course.
- 6. If a group's pace of play warrants a penalty to be assessed, only players who contributed to slow play will be penalized, not necessarily every member of the team.
- 7. Officials will use discretion concerning the pace of play of early groups. The first players will be expected to play at a reasonably fast pace. However, the groups immediately following may not be expected to maintain position behind an exceptionally fast group.



<u>UIL Golf Disqualifications</u>

Subchapter C. Section 1260. UIL Constitution and Contest Rules.

(8) **Disqualifications:** A player disqualified (for other than an unsportsmanlike conduct violation) shall have the disqualification apply only to the 18-hole round in which the infraction occurred.

(a) For example, a contestant disqualified (for a violation that is not unsportsmanlike) during the first or second 18-holes will not have his/her score used for the team score in the 18-hole round in which the violation occurred.

(b) A contestant disqualified for unsportsmanlike conduct during the first 18-holes will not be allowed to continue. Scores from the first 18-hole round for a contestant disqualified during the second 18-holes will also be cancelled. Neither the first day 18-hole score nor the second day 18-hole score may be used for the individual or team score.

Please note that in accordance with Rule 5.6 of the USGA Golf rules, a player that must discontinue play due to illness or injury may not be subject to disqualification if the Rules Committee is notified and the reason, such as illness, is considered satisfactory to the Committee. A student, who discontinues play but is not disqualified the first day, may be allowed by the Committee to return and play 18 holes on the second day. The score of the second day, in this instance, may be counted for team honors.



Spectator Rules

- 1. Spectators must stay on cart path at all times. **EXCEPTION:** when watching play on or around the green spectators may go up on the mounds that surround the green to watch. Spectators need to stay 30 yards from the players.
- 2. Spectators **MAY NOT** walk down the fairway with the players.
- 3. Spectators need to stay 30 yards from the players at all times.
- 4. Spectators are allowed to help search for lost golf balls.
- 5. Spectators are **NOT** allowed to give players snacks or drinks during the stipulated round. **ONLY** the designated coach may give the players snacks or drinks.
- 6. Spectators are **NOT** allowed in the scoring area at any time.
- 7. Spectators **MAY NOT** give any advice during play. **ONLY** the designated coach may give the player advice during a stipulated round. Any other communication could be deemed advice. The player could be penalized 2 strokes for every breach or disqualified.
- 8. Spectators **MAY NOT** shuttle players at any time. **EXCEPTION:** In the event of inclement weather or dangerous situation, spectators **MAY** transport players to safety.
